FORE fundraising ideas to get started...

Tournament for CLAPA

As the ultimate golf fundraiser, a charity tournament has big potential to get the pounds rolling in for a great cause. You can get your local club on board and take over the course for the day, with golfers paying a donation fee to enter the challenge.

Charity golf tournament ideas can include a standard 18-hole game or lots of mini-challenges around the course.

Some ideas for the day:

Sharks and camels

Every golfer pays $\pounds 1$ each time their ball goes in the water or a bunker.

Scramble

All players tee off and then choose which shot is best. Each player takes their next shot within one club length of the selected ball (but no closer to the hole). Could you repeat until all balls are holed?

Best ball

On each hole, only the lowest score in the group is counted.

Foursome

Players take alternate shots of the same ball in pairs until it's holed. Remember to switch who tees off.

Competition ideas

- Nearest to the hole
- Lowest team score
- Best adjusted (handicap) score
- Longest drive

Golf-a-thon

Members are sponsored for playing 12 or 24 hours at their favourite course or driving range.

Longest day of golf

Four rounds on the longest day of the year. Members are sponsored for 72 holes and 20 miles of walking.

Crazy golf competition
